Journey Onward Ye Sojourners Caroline Trimble Pastoral Associate

One cannot journey this life in any way -physically - emotionally - mentally - spiritually - without carrying something. During our day we are typically asked to help someone carry something – groceries - boxes – babies – etc.... Sometimes, the items are heavier and more challenging to maneuver like a piano, or a sofa. No matter the size or task, we accept to help and lighten the load for the other! Did you realize that there is something each one of us carries everyday - knowingly or unknowingly - a cross. The cross that we carry bears our own sins. sufferings, sacrifices, trials, and when we unite our little cross with the cross that Jesus bore, we become transformed. We are transformed by Love - in Love - and for Love - because the cross is the symbol of Love. The very Love that the Son of God took upon himself in order to redeem humankind. The cross is the pathway to a Life of Love - a life that leads to the Father. Pick up your cross, help others carry theirs and journey onward to the Kingdom. Keep to the J.O.Y.S.

FROM FR. MARK: A Labor Day Reflection Christ Himself took up the tools of a carpenter, working with human hands for most of His life on earth. Work is, in the words of John Paul II, "a fundamental dimension of Man's existence on earth" ("Laborem Exercens," No. 4). The Church, in reflecting on the dignity and purpose of human work, offers the faithful a rich vein of social teaching. Among the teachings the Church commends for reflection, criteria for judgment and action, I would offer the following taken from our bishops' conference statement "A Catholic Framework for Economic Life:"

- The economy exists for the person, not the person for the economy.
- A fundamental moral measure of any economy is how the poor and vulnerable are faring.
- All people have a right to life and to secure the basic necessities of life (e.g. food, clothing, shelter, education, health care, safe environment, economic security).
- All people have the right to economic initiative, to productive work, to just wages and benefit, to decent working conditions, as well as to organize and join unions or other associations.

These seem especially appropriate for our reflection on Labor Day. Therefore, Church teachings rightly remind us of the value of work: among other things, work enhances our human dignity, it is needed in order to form and maintain a family, and it contributes to the common good of our local, national and global communities. Workers today, like my parents in their time, know the value of what they do in order to provide for themselves and their families and to contribute to the development of society. Yet they also know the difficulties and challenges their work can bring, especially the need to balance time spent at work with time spent at home with their families.

These challenges are similar to those my own parents faced. Yet amidst all of the difficulties, my parents lived with hope. They were not alone. The Lord was with them. They drew near to the Lord every Sunday in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

This Labor Day, let us reflect on the value of work and on how we recognize and respect the dignity of all workers, including those who have immigrated to our country. Undoubtedly we can do more. I pray that we are first and foremost a people of charity. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mk 12:31).


